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Message to Educators

Thank you for your interest in the NoahStrong School Program. The NoahStrong Organization emerged from the enormous impact of Noah Dugas who humbly united and inspired communities through exemplary values of kindness, compassion, determination and bravery.

On August 30th, 2020, North Bay and communities from all over rallied together in support of the Dugas family. Noah Dugas, 13 years of age, had suffered a stroke and was fighting to recover. Noah was a popular and talented boy who was loved by anyone who had the pleasure of knowing him. He was humble, never seeking attention but always looking to help and support others. Noah faced his health challenges with his usual determination and strength and offered messages of inspiration, positivity and love to his family, friends and the community that supported him through his fight. On November 13th, 2020, Noah suffered a brain bleed that sadly led to his sudden passing. Noah's family made the difficult decision to donate his organs to others in need. This brave and selfless 13-year-old went on to help seven other lives through his generous gift of organ donation. It was not by chance, that Noah wore the number 71, while playing sports, as this *one* amazing young man was able to save the lives of *seven* other individuals.

Following his initial stroke, Noah attended school at the Holland Bloorview Rehabilitation Centre. He was asked to complete a self-evaluation and his response included the following nine affirmations. In Noah's words:

"I am Kind, I am Strong, I am Helpful, I can do Hard Things, I can Reach my Goals, I am a Leader, I am Resilient, I am Brave, I am Loved."

Today, the Dugas family continues to champion the spirit of giving through the NoahStrong Organization. These powerful affirmations inspire and guide all of our actions. We hope that your school members will consider taking the NoahStrong Ambassador Pledge (www.NoahStrong.ca) and join us in honouring Noah and the 7N1D Movement that he inspired. By taking the pledge, students are agreeing to be NoahStrong Ambassadors and to do their best each day to live their lives NoahStrong! These ambassadors are champions in their schools and communities.

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Noah Dugas' Story

February 2020 - Noah Starts To Feel Unwell

Noah Dugas was a young, healthy and vibrant 13-year-old. He enjoyed the outdoors and being active. His main passion was hockey, but he also loved waterskiing, dirt biking, fishing and so many other sports and activities. Not only did Noah excel in athletics, but he was also an honour student with a love and gift for music. He took pride in his health, eating well and working out daily.

It was therefore completely unexpected when Noah started to feel unwell while playing hockey in February 2020. He developed sudden headaches and diminished vision on his right side. Medical attention was immediately sought but nothing concerning was originally identified. As a result, Noah's initial treatment followed general concussion protocols. It wasn't until March 13th that an optometrist appointment urgently led Noah to the ER for a CT scan. That was the day that we learned that Noah had suffered a stroke! We were understandably shocked by this news.



Mid-March 2020 - Noah Admitted To Hospital

We immediately drove to the Children Hospital of Eastern Ontario (CHEO) in Ottawa where Noah spent the next week undergoing multiple tests. He was such a trooper through it all! He was always thanking the nurses and doctors even when uncomfortable procedures needed to be repeated. He remained positive and never once expressed his discontentment with missing out on his March Break.

At the end of the week, doctors were still unable to determine the cause of the stroke, so Noah was prescribed two needles of blood thinners daily for 6 months to help dissolve the blood clot and prevent any new clots from forming. This treatment also meant no contact sports or activities that would risk any serious bleeding.



Summer 2020 - Best Summer Ever!

Despite these restrictions, Noah cautiously worked out every day and was more determined than ever to return stronger and better to the sports he loved. He spent the best summer of his life enjoying the lake, fishing and spending time with family and friends. Once he completed his treatment, he finally was able to waterski, ride his dirt bike and play hockey once again.



End of August 2020 - Symptoms Unfortunately Return

On August 29th, Noah's symptoms unfortunately returned, and he was rushed to Sick Kids Hospital in Toronto where an MRI revealed another stroke from blood clots. This is when the NoahStrong movement emerged. We received tremendous support from our family, friends, local community and even from hockey stars such as Auston Matthews, Jonathan Toews and John Tavares (to name but a few.) Noah's story was also featured by Ron MacLean on Hockey Night in Canada during the Stanley Cup playoffs. For a young hockey player and his family, this support was incredibly powerful and emotional.



September - October 2020 - Continued Challenges

Noah fought very hard to come back to us as he faced mounting challenges. He was unable to speak or move his arms and legs. He slowly regained movement in his left arm and leg and began communicating through an alphabet board. Noah was transferred to Holland Bloorview Hospital where he continued his rehabilitation. We soon realized that our brave boy was finding his strength, his humour and his positive outlook despite this enormous battle. All the love, prayers, and support seemed to be helping as he showed significant improvements every day. As part of his schoolwork at Bloorview, Noah developed a series of affirmations that became our daily reminder of his strength, love and determination in overcoming the many challenges that he faced. Noah's words included:

*"I am kind. I am strong. I am helpful. I can do hard things. I can reach my goals. I am a leader. I am resilient. I am brave. I am loved."
(Noah Dugas)*



November 2020 - Noah's Passing and Legacy

On November 13th, 2020 an unexpected brain bleed took Noah Dugas' life. A family and a community were left to mourn this beautiful young soul. Noah's journey here on earth was completed. His legacy will live on through all those that loved him.

His final gift was enriching seven lives through organ donation. Noah left such an incredible mark on the world by showing great strength, compassion, and resiliency. He united a community that rallied and supported him and his family. For this, the Dugas family is eternally grateful. Noah's affirmations continue to guide us and have inspired the creation of the NoahStrong organization. This organization honours Noah's legacy by supporting youth, families, and communities through the promotion, facilitation, and celebration of acts of kindness, selflessness, and resiliency.

- The NoahStrong *Accommodations Program*, in partnership with the North Bay Regional Health Centre assists with the short-term accommodation needs of direct caregivers whose loved ones are unexpectedly hospitalized.

4. Advancing information and understanding about youth stroke.

- NoahStrong supports pediatric rehabilitation research.
- The NoahStrong Pediatric Resident Bursary was established to raise awareness of pediatric stroke through Noah's story. This bursary supports pediatric residents from the Northern Ontario School of Medicine (NOSM).

Bravery Beads Program

The Bravery Heart Bead Program at SickKids Hospital and Holland Bloorview Rehabilitation Hospital helps children, youth and families who are experiencing a serious illness by collecting beads that represent their unique journeys. Each bead symbolizes a procedure or aspect of their health care. The collection of beads tells the story of challenges and strength of each child.

The Bravery Bead Program run by the Women's Auxiliary Volunteers (WAV) invites patients at SickKids the opportunity to collect a different bead for each procedure or event while undergoing treatment. The colourful beads are not given as a reward, but rather are earned, and they represent the unique and special treatment journey of each child. The collection of beads tells a story of challenges and strength. The beads are collected making a meaningful necklace showing the child's bravery. NoahStrong Bravery Beads Classroom Activity



Classes can include Bravery Beads as another way to actively engage with the NoahStrong affirmations. Students can make their own bracelets by reflecting on each of Noah affirmations and considering how these can apply to their daily lives and actions.

Each month, classes can focus on one of the nine NoahStrong affirmations. Students can earn beads based on chosen classroom activities. At the end of the program, each coloured bead (representing one of the nine affirmations) can be assembled to produce a NoahStrong bracelet. This special bracelet can serve as a reminder of the NoahStrong Ambassador pledge and its importance in students' lives. NoahStrong certificates (included on pages 24-26) can also be used to acknowledge student efforts.

Green Shirt Day

April 7th

On April 6, 2018, Canadians rallied in support of the victims, survivors and families of the tragic Humboldt Broncos Bus Crash. A year later, 2019, the family of Logan Boulet, a Humboldt Bronco hockey player, held their first national Green Shirt Day in honour of Logan who passed away on April 7th, 2018. Before his passing, Logan helped save the lives of 6 individuals through his generous gift of organ donation.

In the weeks after Logan's passing, his story inspired more than 150,000 Canadians to become registered organ donors. This became known as the "Logan Boulet Effect". Today, his family continue to champion the spirit of giving through Green Shirt Day.

For the NoahStrong Family, this story is close to our hearts. Noah was a healthy and talented young hockey player who proudly wore the #71 on his jersey. His unexpected passing at the age of 13 of a stroke was incomprehensible. Noah's organ donation, however, gave hope and health to 7 individuals and their families. Because of his caring and compassionate nature, Noah lives on today. Seven lives (7) were saved by One (1) incredible young man. The number 71 continues to remind us of how special Noah was and how his story of selflessness and courage can inspire needed conversations and action around organ awareness and registry.

The NoahStrong organization's goal is to enhance more lives of Ontarians waiting for life saving procedures by advocating for organ and tissue donation consent. The Gift of 8 campaign recognizes that **one** organ donor can possibly save up to **eight lives** and enhance the lives of **75 others** through tissue donation. You can check your status and register consent to be an organ donor by clicking on [Noah's personal campaign page](#). It just takes two minutes, and you could one day help to save lives, just as Noah did.

We hope to inspire more families to have the conversation with their loved ones about their wishes of Organ Donation. Please wear your green shirt on April 7th, to help raise awareness about organ and tissue donation.



Green Shirt Day Facts

- Each province in Canada has a different way to register one's intent to become an organ and tissue donor. Please visit [Organ and tissue donation at Canadian Blood Services](#) to learn more about organ and tissue donation.
- 90% of Canadians are in support of organ donation, however only 1 in three Ontarians have registered their consent to donate. Talk to your loved ones about your donation decision.
- Consent for organ donation is legal at the age of 16.
- Currently in Ontario, there are over 1,500 people on the waiting list for organ transplant.
- Raising awareness about the importance of organ and tissue donation, as well as having these discussions before a tragedy happens is a gift to you and your family in a time of grief and sadness.
- Starting the conversation about organ donation is hard. Green Shirt day is a good day to start this talk and make your wishes known to your loved ones.
